# Today's Toxified Environment Triggers the Epidemic of Childhood Illnesses in the U.S., Reveals the Book POISONED PROFITS

Oct. 14 - Authors Hold Call to Action with Physicians for Social Responsibility-LA

(LOS ANGELES, CA) With indisputable data, <u>Poisoned Profits: The Toxic Assault on Our Children</u> reveals that the children of baby boomers—the first to be raised in a truly toxified world—have higher rates of birth defects, asthma, cancer, autism and a frightening range of other neurological illnesses from ADHD to mental retardation, compared to previous generations. The book was researched and written under the sponsorship of Greater Boston Physicians for Social Responsibility (GBPSR), sister chapter of Physicians for Social Responsibility-Los Angeles (PSR-LA).

On Oct 14, 6:30pm, at All Saints Church in Pasadena, PSR-LA will host a Discussion and Call to Action with the book's authors, Philip and Alice Shabecoff, and cosponsoring organizations focused on social and environmental justice. Special guest speaker will be Joseph K. Lyou, PhD, Executive Director of the California Environmental Rights Alliance (CERA) and South Coast Air Quality Management District Governing Board Member. In <u>Poisoned Profits</u>, the Shabecoffs reveal that one out of two pregnancies fails to come to term or results in a less than healthy child. Premature births and infertility are on the rise as this generation matures, while the ratio of male babies dwindles. The book explains how a child is much more vulnerable to toxins than an adult, how genes and the environment interact, and how toxic exposures from conception to early life can set a person's cellular code for life which can cause illness from childhood until old age.

Just as important, this book exposes how damaging evidence is routinely concealed by the companies that profit from toxics, abetted by government collusion, scientists-for-hire, lobbyists, lawyers and cynical public relations. It tells the poignant stories of families and communities harmed as the result.

<u>Poisoned Profits</u> is in the end a book about hope and optimism. Now we know what is happening. These poisons are manmade; manufacturers can take them out of our children's lives and make profits from safe 'green' products. The authors offer guidance to parents (and pregnant women and pregnancy-planning couples) about how to protect their children, and to all reader-citizens on how to bring about change, describing where to go for more advice, including websites, books, organizations and scientists ready to answer parents' questions.


